What ingredients are in the AstraZeneca vaccine?



AstraZeneca (VaxZevria)
vaccine is made up of
active ingredient,
emulsifiers, preservatives,
amino acids, salts, sugars
and waters.



What is the active ingredient?



Modified virus (adenovirus). Adenoviruses are common viruses that can cause a variety of illnesses (e.g. Bronchitis, conjunctivitis).

It has been changed in the vaccine so that it cannot cause an infection. It has been tested for other diseases such as influenza (flu).



What do the emulsifiers & preservatives do?



Emulsifiers: help the oil and water-based ingredients stay together.



Preservatives: are added to keep vaccines free of contamination, like bacteria.



What do amino acids and salts do?



Amino Acids: are used to stabilise the vaccine and make sure it stays good when transported and stored.



Salts: help balance out acidity so it is better stored and similar with the body tissue it is injected into.



What do the sugars & water do?



Sugars: stop the molecules from losing their shape during the intense freezing process.



Water: most of the vaccines are made from water to make it easier to inject.



List of ingredients for the Astra Zeneca vaccine:

Active Ingredients

One dose (0.5 mL) contains 5x1010 viral particles (vp) of ChAdOx1-S.

Other Ingredients (Excipients)

- Histidine (Amino acids)
- Histidine hydrochloride monohydrate (Amino acids)
- Sodium chloride (Salts)
- Magnesium chloride hexahydrate
- Disodium edetate (EDTA) (Preservatives)
- Sucrose (Sugars)
- Ethanol absolute (Preservatives)
- Polysorbate 80 (Emulsifiers)
- Water for injections (Water)
