# What are the potential side effects to the COVID-19 vaccines?



## Most people experience noormild side effects that last for a day or two after the vaccination.



### Common vaccine side effects:



### pain or swelling at the injection site



tiredness



joint pain



### Common vaccine side effects:



### fever and chills



headaches



muscle pain



### Less common side effects for all vaccines:

- redness
- itching at the injection site
- feeling unwell / nausea
- enlarged lymph nodes
- pain in limb
- insomnia

These side effects are **mild** and usually **last a day or two** after the vaccination.



# Less common side effects for Astrazeneca (Vaxzervia):

- dizziness
- decreased appetite
- stomach pain



# Rare side effects for Pfizer & Moderna (Spikevax):

- Myocarditis (inflammation of the heart muscle)
- Pericarditis (inflammation of the outer lining of the heart)
- Anaphylaxis: severe allergic reaction



## Rare side effects for Astrazeneca (Vaxzervia):

- Anaphylaxis: severe allergic reaction
- Thrombosis with thrombocytopenia syndrome (TTS): blood clotting (thrombosis) and low platelet levels (thrombocytopenia)
